

### WATER QUALITY MONITORING

As we approach summer and swimming season many residents may have concerns about the water quality of the swimming lakes in our neighbourhood. Swimming safety is just one of the reasons why the WLCC has been monitoring the water quality in Williams Lake since 1994. Although HRM officials (Environmental Performance (Water) Sustainable Environment Management Office) also monitor water quality in HRM lakes including Williams Lake, their samples are often collected in May and October, non-swimming months for most of us. The WLCC water samples are collected by volunteers mid-summer. Thanks to membership dues we have been able to have samples tested by the Capital Health District Authority. Both the WLCC testing (results for samples taken near the dam end are shown below) and the testing by HRM indicate that the main body of Williams Lake has consistently been safe for swimming, even during past hot dry summers (HRM closes supervised swimming areas if fecal coliform counts are above 200 per 100 mL). We can be proud to live in an urban area that offers such a valuable recreational resource as Williams Lake that is in such good condition.
